ASIA

PARIS, DEC. 3-7, 2012

After consultation of students (some of them need to follow also external lectures) and a few changes in teachers' agendas, the following schedule is proposed.

Students' seminars will take place on Tuesday and Friday afternoon

The QP11 module is both a teaching module and a scientific seminar integrated in the Erasmus Mundus Quaternary and Prehistory master partnership and also other scientific networks: it is therefore an opportunity for students in prehistory, scientists and teachers to meet along one week, exchange ideas and develop contacts.

Lectures are therefore most often ground on former and current projects developed by the teaching staff ; discussions are encouraged ; PhD and Master students involved in Southeast Asian Prehistory present their work.

Validation of the module (3 ECTS) is prepared as a shorter seminar (c. 10 mn) grounding on either personal experience (for students working about the area) or on the analysis of a couple of papers dealing with a specific question of regional interest. Members of the teaching-staff will provide the papers and keep in touch with the students before the module. Depending on the number of registered students, one seminar may be prepared by two students.

Part of the students and teaching participants do not speak French, meaning that English, as a communication tool, has to be spoken as much as possible. For participants who absolutely need to present a lecture or a validation seminar in French, please ensure that the Powerpoint presentation is in English and informative enough.

The following schedule will be subject to some changes, depending on teaching-staff availability. Except visits, the activities will be organized at the Institut de Paléontologie Humaine, 1, rue René Panhard 75013 PARIS (Métro St Marcel).
